## Tour Itinerary

### Monday 12th October 2026

This morning we depart Birmingham Airport, heading to the beautiful island of Guernsey. Located off the Normandy coast, the island has wonderful scenic walking trails as well as a wealth of history to discover. Upon arrival we will transfer to our lovely hotel with time to settle in before dinner. (D)

### Tuesday 13th October 2026

After breakfast, we walk through the lanes of St Martin's towards Fermain Bay, a pebbled bay tucked away on the rugged east coast. Here we join the clifftop path, adorned with pretty autumnal foliage, and walk to St Martin's Point at the south east tip of the island, where we stop at a nearby hotel for lunch (at own expense). We stroll back to our hotel along the cliff path, admiring the stunning ocean views. (B,D)

### Wednesday 14th October 2026

With a short drive into St Peter Port this morning, to catch our ferry across to the enchanting car free island of Sark. Take a tractor drive to the top of town, where you will find cafes, shops to peruse, pretty old streets and narrow lanes to wander through. Join your Tour Manager for a gentle walk, crossing La Coupee (the isthmus of sedimentary rock connecting Big Sark and Little Sark) on the island's lovely footpaths or explore at your own pace. We take a return ferry back to Guernsey this afternoon, with free time to freshen up before dinner. (B,D)

### Thursday 15th October 2026

Walking from the hotel, this morning we enjoy a relaxing stroll to Petit Bot Bay. Petit Bot is a pretty cove set at the base of two wooded valleys with a beautiful wide sandy beach exposed at low tide. On this lovely clifftop walk, you will encounter several sets of steps en-route. After our walk you have the remainder of the day at leisure. Perhaps take a taxi into St Peter Port, where you can explore Castle Cornet and its museums or simply stroll along the promenade. Victor Hugo lived in exile on Guernsey for 15 years and his statue can be found in Candie Garden. We once again dine as a group at the hotel. (B,D)

## Itinerary Continued...

### Friday 16th October 2026

Today is a full day tour of the island, begin by heading north, passing through St Peter Port to the magnificent beach of Pembroke Bay, and then continue via the Folk & Costume Museum, giving an insight into an earlier age of Island life. We stop for lunch at Guernsey Pearl (at own expense) before making our way to picturesque Portelet, a traditional fishing harbour. Here there's the option to either take a short beach or headland walk. If tides permit, we can cross the causeway to Lihou, an important nature conservation area with an abundance of bird and marine life. Heading back towards the parish of St Martins, stopping en-route at The Little Chapel, built by Brother Deodat, one of Guernsey's most iconic tourist attractions due to its fascinating décor. (B,D)

### Saturday 17th October 2026

Our coach will once again take us into St Peter Port, where we take the short 20 minute hop by ferry across to the tranquil and car-free island of Herm. Arriving either at the harbour steps or at the quayside depending on the tide and then walk the pathway along to the main village. Here you overlook a picturesque harbour with stretches of golden sandy beaches. This really is a paradise of quaint pastel painted buildings. Perhaps wander the lanes to the other side of the island, browse the gift shops or simply take in the views from the White House Hotel where lunch and refreshments may be taken (at own expense). Later we take the return ferry and meet our coach for the drive back to our hotel in time to freshen up before dinner. (B,D)

### Sunday 18th October 2026

After a leisurely start to our day we travel back to Guernsey Airport for our flight to Birmingham. Arriving into Staffordshire late afternoon. (B)

## La Barbarie Hotel, Guernsey

## Regent Walking & Mobility

Walks can be lengthened or shortened according to ability, Guernsey has a great selection of coastal paths and inland walks which you can follow. Guided walks advertised consist of approximately 3-5 hours of walking per day, over varied but comfortable paths and undulating terrain. Walking distances range between an average of 3-5 miles per day.

It is possible to visit Guernsey without participating in the advertised walking programme, however you must be able to walk up and down steps, board and alite coaches/ferries unaided. There may be steps to negotiate when boarding the inter island ferries.

All special requests such as health and dietary requirements must be given at time of booking and are not guaranteed. Regent must be informed if health declines over the booking period.
